

Our 10 Point Plan

Rural Australians for Refugees calls on the Australian Government to seek solutions at a global, regional and national level to address the international asylum seeker and refugee crisis.

As a Nation ... Australia should

- 1. Receive asylum seekers in accordance with the humane standards set out in the United Nations Convention on Refugees which Australia signed in 1954.
- 2. Close all off-shore and remote detention centres and take full responsibility for processing asylum seeker claims here in Australia.
- 3. Rescind all current legislation that condones and even encourages human rights violations and establish a formal multi-party parliamentary committee to draft refugee and asylum seeker policies that will gain bipartisan support.
- 4. Do more to improve public understanding of the plight of asylum seeker issues and to dispel common myths.
- 5. Provide orientation, training and support to urban and rural communities willing to assist refugees with accommodation and employment.
- 6. Redesign the current punitive, expensive and inefficient immigration system to a system that is efficient, transparent & just. (bold added, to indicate that this is a new point)

In our Region ... Australia should:

- 7. Work with our Asia Pacific neighbours to find co-operative and non-punitive solutions to the flow of refugees into and through the region.
- 8. Ensure that countries currently hosting disproportionate numbers of refugees are given appropriate support.

In the Global context ... Australia should:

- 9. Seek a world -wide increase in aid for refugees.
- 10. Seek to influence oppressive governments who are persecuting their minority groups.
